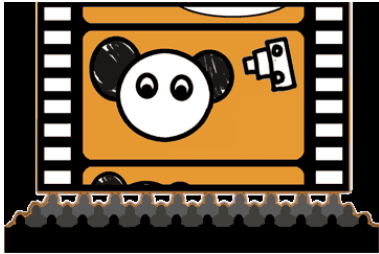

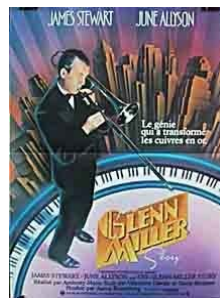
Plymyard Hall Allotments, Eastham, Wirral
