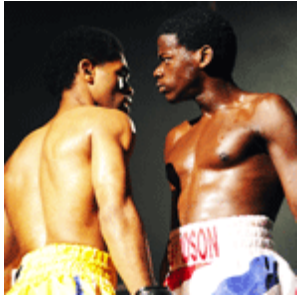

### Anglican Cathedral

#### **Lady Chapel Archive Exhibition**



To Thursday 8th July 2010 9am -5pm (each day)

The Lady Chapel celebrated its centenary in June 2010 and it was the first part of the Cathedral to be consecrated (on St Peter's Day 1910). All services were held there

for the first fourteen years of the Cathedral's life until the main part of the Cathedral was finished and consecrated in 1924. It is at the east end of the

building, and can be reached by a staircase from a gallery opening out of the south choir aisle. It also has its own main entrance from outside, on the Queen's Walk which runs alongside the Cathedral.

Those who do know the Lady Chapel also recognise its importance as an historical and social statement about the rights of women.

The Lady Chapel staircase and Atrium house the 'Noble Women' windows; twenty three stained glass panels commemorating women who had made an important contribution to society throughout history. The Liverpool Diocesan Girls Friendly Society raised £200 from its members to pay for these windows. Subjects include Queen Victoria, Elizabeth Barrett Browning and Christina Rossetti, Elizabeth Fry, Grace Darling, Catherine Gladstone and Susanna Wesley. Alongside the likes of poets, Christina Rossetti and Elizabeth Barrett Browning are Josephine Butler, Agnes Jones and Kitty Wilkinson – all social reformers with important links to Liverpool. The windows were designed by J.W Brown and installed in 1910 which is suprising given that women did not even have the vote until 1918, and the Cathedral Stained Glass Committee consisted exclusively of men.
